COPE Classes are mandated by the State of Ohio for all adults divorcing. There will be 2-3 (2 hour classes), depending on the needs of the participants. COPE offers an in-depth look at how to make divorce a little easier for all parties, especially the children. The COPE Program is evidence based. COPE helps divorcing parents learn to work with one another without putting the children in the middle. This helps to lessen the trauma of the divorce. The Missing Link also does follow up with all participants to see how the adjustments are going and if the parties are in need of any other services.

Anyone may sign up for COPE Classes. Divorcing couples are not permitted to take the class at the same time. Due to the sensitive nature of the subject, children are not to be present for COPE Classes.

All participants must complete orientation prior to first class.
